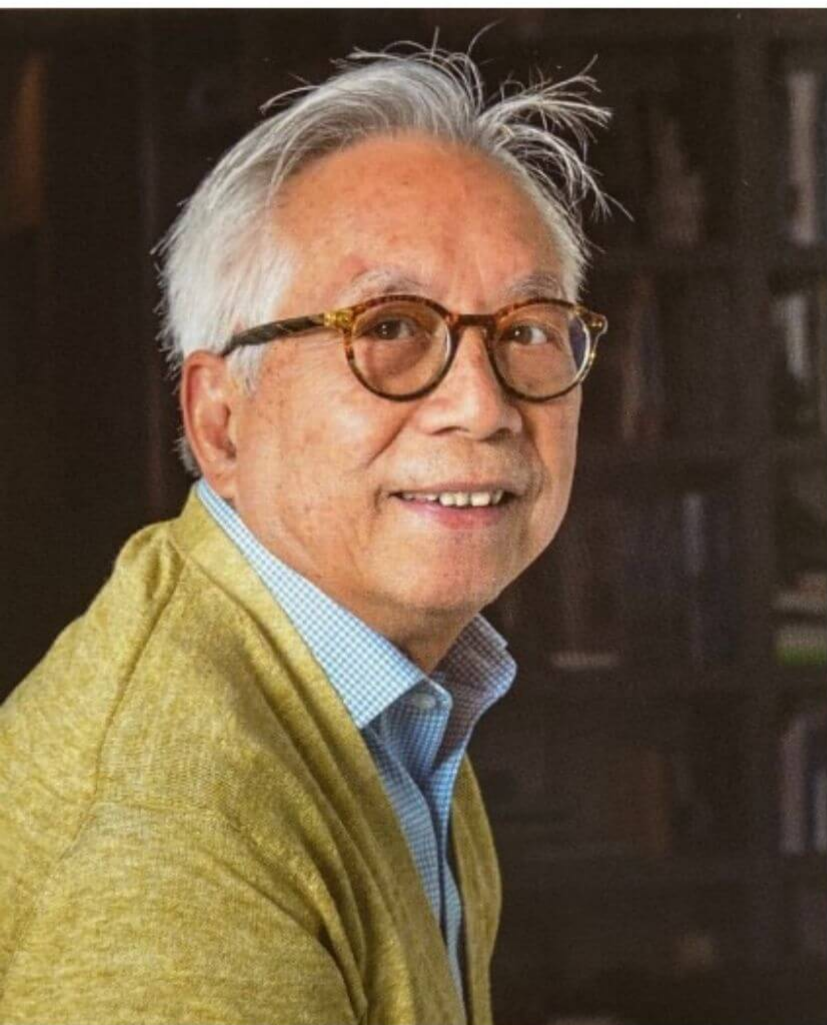


LIU HEUNG SHING

PULITZER PRIZE WINNING PHOTOJOURNALIST



Liu Heung Shing was born in Hong Kong and worked as a photojournalist and foreign correspondent for Time and Associated Press from 1973 to 1992 in Beijing, Los Angeles, New Delhi, Seoul and Moscow. In 1992, Liu shared a Pulitzer Prize in spot news photography for the AP for his images of the attempted coup in Russia and the subsequent collapse of the Communist regime. During his 40 years photographing China, Liu has won many awards, including for a defining moment during the 1989 Tiananmen protests that was awarded Picture of the Year by the University of Missouri. Liu was also named best photographer by the Associated Press Managing Editors in the same year. In 2015, he founded the Shanghai Center of Photography.
